



The predecessor of the NCCP, the Peterborough Newcomers Language Orientation Committee, was founded in 1979.

In 1987, the Committee became Incorporated as the New Canadians Centre Peterborough.

Soon after, the offices relocated to the current Sherbrooke St. location. The Centre has been growing consistenly ever since, expanding in 2002 and 2008, and opening an itinerant office in Cobourg.

The budget has also grown significantly over the years, as has community awareness of the NCC. This growth and increased visibility helps the NCC to better meet the needs of newcomers.

The future looks promising as the Peterborough area is reconizing the importance of immigrant integration, and the NCC is sure to continue to strengthen its role in the years to come.

# CARMELA VALLES RESIGNS AS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is with regret that the Board of Directors announces the resignation of Carmela Valles as the Executive Director of the New Canadians Centre Peterborough, effective August 31, 2009.

Ms. Valles began her employment with the New Canadians Centre (NCCP) as Host Coordinator in 1997 and became the Executive Director in 2000. Under her leadership, the Centre grew in size and complexity. Many programs and services were added so that the Centre could better meet the



language, educational, employment and settlement needs of new Canadians. Examples of these additional services include translation/interpretation, a public access computer site, computer classes, extended employment programs, a women's group, youth groups, and day trips in and around Peterborough and Ontario. In 2006, the NCCP became the sole organizer of the popular International Canada Day celebration in Del Crary Park, which attracts hundreds of community members and vendors annually.

Ms. Valles' success can easily be seen in the growth of the Centre. In the current year, the Centre's nine permanent staff and hundreds of volunteers assisted more than 500 new Canadians from over 75 different countries. The Centre has expanded twice, mostly recently in January of 2009, and last year the Centre added a satellite office and a counsellor in Cobourg so that the growing population of new Canadians in Northumberland County could more easily access services.

Ms. Valles provided the leadership to ensure that the New Canadians Centre would be well-connected with the broader Peterborough community. Through her tenure as Executive Director, numerous partnerships were forged with a wide variety of Peterborough agencies to complete projects for the advancement of Peterborough City and region. This resulted in new and innovative programs and resources for new Canadians such as the New Canadian Employment Initiative in partnership with COIN, the Newcomers Guide to Peterborough County in partnership with the Workforce Development Board, and the Mother Goose program in partnership with the Peterborough Public Library. Recently, she played a key role in establishing the Peterborough Partnership Council on Immigrant Integration and in securing government funding for its operations. The Partnership Council brings together individuals and leaders from more than 30 different local organizations to plan and to achieve a more inclusive



Peterborough.

Ms. Valles has a completely unique approach to leadership and is deeply appreciated by her employees."Carmela believes 100% in all of us" says Ziysah Markson, who has been working at the Centre since 2002. Hajni Hos, Partnership Council Coordinator, adds, "She is not only an amazing supervisor, but as a newcomer herself, she is also an excellent role model." Staff will miss her warmth, passion and dedication to helping others and wish her all the best in the future.

Ms. Valles has chosen to resign as Executive Director in order to focus her energies on the well-being of her family. She plans to continue her work of helping New Canadians in the Peterborough area by operating as the city's first immigration consultant. Ms. Valles stated that she plans to stay involved with the Centre through active participation in the Peterborough Partnership Council on Immigrant Integration.

## **REPORT FROM THE CHAIR OF THE BOARD**

The New Canadians Centre experienced a year of substantial achievements in 2008-2009. The Board approved the expansion and reorganization of staff at the Centre to enhance the services to new Canadian clients and to increase the promotion of the Centre's vision of immigrant integration within the Peterborough community. The Board adopted a new four-tiered compensation grid system to reward better our skilled staff within the limits of the funding available to the organization. The Board also approved a substantial physical expansion of the offices of the New Canadians Centre at its Sherbrooke Street site in downtown Peterborough.

The Personnel/Nominating Committee is continuing to rewrite personnel/employment policies. This work will enable the Board to complete an employee manual within the next few years.

The Policy Committee reviewed the Board of Directors Manual to ensure consistency between the contents of the various documents and the By-laws of the Organization. This review will enable the Committee and the Board to review the By-laws within the coming year to initiate reforms and to increase clarity in the governance rules and procedures of the organization.

The Community Outreach Committee continued the work connected with the "re-branding" initiative. Signs displaying our new distinctive logo were created for the New Canadians Centre offices. The Community Outreach Committee also improved the popular monthly Pot-Luck dinners for new Canadians by adding international music and dance to two of the events held at Market Hall. Next year, the Committee will be continuing this innovation. The Committee is planning, through numerous projects, to highlight the achievements of new Canadians within the Peterborough community and to emphasize the attainments of the New Canadians Centre during its 30th Anniversary Year in 2009-2010.

The Client Outreach Committee has been planning the design of a new website which will better serve our new Canadian clients and better inform the Peterborough community of the importance of immigrants and of the significant work being done by the New Canadians Centre. The plan is in its final stages and an improved website shall be established during the 30th Anniversary Year.

The Board was particularly pleased to participate in the launch of the Peterborough Partnership on Immigrant Integration last December. As a leading partner, the Board intends to be a major contributor to the successful work of the new organization in the coming year. Next year, the Partnership shall be defining and pursuing its initial major projects.

As the Chair of the Board, I wish to thank the Directors for their hours of service through the past year. Their wise decision-making, their co-operation as a team and their dedicated work were critical factors producing the success achieved by the organization this year.



# PETERBOROUGH PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL ON IMMIGRANT INTEGRATION

In an effort to create a cohesive regional response to the emerging needs of newcomers, the New Canadians Centre took the lead in a partnership with the City of Peterborough and about thirty local organizations to establish the Peterborough Partnership Council on Immigrant Integration.

After months of preparation with the founding members, the Council was officially launched on December 3, 2008 at Market Hall. John MacDonald of the Municipal Social Planning Steering Committee, City Councillor Dean Pappas, and Andy Mitchell of the GPAEDC made addresses and provided background on the Council.

The Council meets every two months to share information, make decisions, and respond to pressing issues. The Council has formed three active committees: the Integration Strategy Committee, the Resource Development and Marketing Committee, and the Executive Committee. Terms of Reference for the Council and for each committee have been developed, as well as an Action Plan for the creation of an integration strategy.

Over the next several months, the Council will be developing a community strategy that helps facilitate the meaningful and successful integration of immigrants in the Peterborough area. The mandate of the Council is to ensure that the City and County of Peterborough is better equipped to attract, retain and integrate new Canadians into an inclusive and welcoming environment.

All organizations, municipalities, businesses, community members, and new Canadians are invited to become members of the Council. There is no cost for membership.

## PURPOSE

The Peterborough Partnership Council on Immigrant Integration exists for promoting, advancing and supporting coordinated immigrant integration (broadly-defined) in our community - regardless of immigrant status or any prohibited ground as outlined in the Ontario Human Rights Code and the Canadian Human Rights Act. We believe immigrant integration is essential for long-term social, economic and environmental community health and quality of life.

## THE COUNCIL'S OBJECTIVES:

To Increase education and awareness for Council members and the general public

To focus on immigrant integration that goes beyond 'over-the-counter' services

To include established community members in immigrant integration

To generally work towards the availability and valuing of a diversified workforce, which contributes to the region's business competitiveness.

To ensure that the sustainability of our physical and built environments is considered in the development of the Immigrant Integration Strategy.
