




Navigating Translation Main Page




Conversation Mode











Navigating Translation Main Page (Microsoft)

General Tips When Using a Translator App

- **Be Patient**: Translation apps may not always provide perfect translations, so be patient and understanding if there are any misunderstandings or errors.
- **Double-Check Important Information**: For critical information or instructions, double-check the translations to ensure accuracy before proceeding.
- Follow Up in Writing: After the meeting, consider following up with written documentation or summaries in both languages to reinforce key points and ensure clarity.
