The **Community Engagement Assistant** will support the community engagement strategy of the NCC by assisting in the planning and facilitation of community programs, activities, and projects. This includes organising events related to the Multicultural Festival in June and supporting programming on July 1st for Lessons from the Land.



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Duties & Responsibilities:

Community Engagement:

- Support the preparation of engagement and promotional materials
- Research communications and marketing tools, resources, and initiatives
- Assist in organising events and activities during the Multicultural Festival in June and Lessons from the Land in July
- Assist, as needed, with client events, trips, and activities
- Assist with data entry following events, as needed
- Update the Welcome to Peterborough Guidebook and Map
- Liaise with community partners to update and renew the Peterborough Welcome Pass program

General Responsibilities:

- Support the mandate of the New Canadians Centre
- Assist in organizing and/or participate in NCC events and activities
- Complete required documentation such as expense reports, timesheets, and travel reimbursements
- Create and maintain a Position-Specific Manual
- Other duties as required

Qualifications:

To be eligible, participants must:

- be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* for the duration of the employment; and.
- have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

International students and work permit holders are not eligible participants. International students include anyone who is temporarily in Canada for studies or work and who is not a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada.

Experience:

- A background in education, communications or event/project management will be highly-valued
- Proficiency with graphics design platforms like Adobe Photoshop and InDesign, and experience with social media is an asset
- Lived experience as a newcomer to Canada or as a member of a marginalized group, as voluntarily self-identified by applicants, is viewed favourably. NCC endeavours to recruit the most competent individuals for all positions while prioritising employment of newcomers and people from marginalized groups.

- Strong attention to detail

- Ability to maintain confidentiality and handle important documents in a sensitive manner

- Ability to maintain a sense of urgency, efficiency, and flexibility
- Cross-cultural communication skills
- Understanding of anti-oppressive language and concepts including power, privilege, intersectionality, and racism
- Ability to extend a warm welcome
- Interest in developing new competencies as needed for the responsibilities of the position
- Professional skills, demeanour, and work ethic
- An interest in and commitment to NCCP's mandate
- Fluency in languages other than English is an asset
